Dear Friend in Christ,

First, I want to thank you for all you do for St. Luke, and for each other. I know so many of you give to St. Luke in so many ways. Our more than 50 active ministries attest to that. I am sending you this letter to introduce our 2011 Stewardship theme: *Treasure in Action -- Transforming Lives*, and to talk a little about how, through our collective commitment to offering our Time, Talent and Treasure to God and His Church, we can transform lives.

As the theme suggests, this year we want to highlight Stewardship of Treasure. Along with time and talent, sharing our treasure is essential to help us transform lives here in our church community and in the local and global community. Many of those more than 50 ministries receive funding from our weekly offering. With this funding we are able to:

- bring the Eucharist to our children for the first time,
- provide a hot meal, warm bed, and fellowship to a homeless person,
- offer forgiveness in the Sacrament of Reconciliation,
- save an unborn child,
- give love to the dying in Jamaica,
- befriend someone who just moved here and knows no-one,
- encourage a young mother,
- and so much more.

We can only do these things through the generous gifts of your time, talent and treasure. This year, we are asking you to sign a stewardship of treasure commitment... that is we are asking that you prayerfully determine the amount of your treasure that you can commit to St. Luke each week or month, to help us continue to transform lives. Knowing the amount of funds coming in each week or month allows for better budgeting and planning so we can say yes to more of those in need of food, shelter, guidance, spiritual growth, encouragement. So you see, your weekly offering does more than keep the lights on here at St. Luke... it helps to shine the light of Christ to so many.

We have provided more information for you about how Stewardship at St. Luke is transforming lives, as well as a Treasure Intention form, a Time and Talent commitment form (the gold sheet), and a return envelope for your privacy. St. Luke Stewardship of Treasure Intention Form



Stewardship is based on the spiritual principles of the Old Testament and the teachings of Jesus; and where it has been implemented, both givers' and receivers' lives have been changed.

How much should I give to St. Luke?

Giving of our time, talent and treasure mainly involves a change of attitude about giving. It's important to think in terms of giving in gratitude to God, of considering how blessed you are, of using your resources for the good of others. Once you have this change of attitude, you will be able to more readily determine, through prayer and planning, the portion of your time, talent, and treasure that you will give.

When you are at peace about the size of your gift, when you do not find yourself making excuses for its size, when you know in your heart that you have been completely honest with God and yourself, then your gift is the proper size.

Once **you** decide the amount of your treasure that you will give to charities overall, you then need to decide how much you will contribute to St. Luke's Offertory each month. Below is a suggestion, for your consideration, of how to distribute your charitable giving.
