

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Recruiting and Working with Volunteer session lead by Gary & Angela

This feedback contains ideas, knowledge and answers from the ministers that attended the *Serve With a Heart Like Jesus* retreat. The participants were asked 5 questions:

1- How do you recruit new volunteers?

Ministers responded that they recruit new volunteers in many different ways such as:

- Word of mouth
- Bulletin
- Searching out where you know they are
- Friends/Acquaintances
- Email Blast
- Screens
- Church Events
- Personal Invitations
- Name tags Change seat in church to met new people
- The green sheet
- Stewardship Sunday
- Pray
- Beg
- Mass Announcement

Findings:

Angela: In our group discussions, everybody came to agreement that the two most effective ways to recruit people (volunteers) are trough personal invitations or word of mouth.

Gary: I believe that as a majority, the participants also believed we should continue to use all forms of communication to reach out to potential volunteers.

2- How many ministries have training for volunteers? How often?

Examples of answers from different ministers:

- RCIA weekly / for a set of period / when needed
- Holy Communion, lectors, altars servers / Twice a year
- Faith formation / once a year (not enough)
- Spanish Music
- Hispanic
- Knights
- Stewardship

- Hope
- Mass Coordinators
- Room in the Inn

Findings:

Angela: Some participants asked: 1) Who trains the trainers?

2) Who monitors quality/effectiveness?

- 3- How are you helping your ministry volunteers grow in their faith? Positive encouragement Scripture reflection Prayers and reflections Warm Inviting attitudes Collaboration (partner with other ministries) Hospitality Building community Being Present Thank you for service Seeing Infliction in others Special Intentions Trainings / Education Testimony / Sharing stories
- 4- How do you deal with volunteers who do not show up when assigned? How do you monitor?

Examples of answers from different ministries:

- Phone interactions
- Volunteers to meet one-on-one
- Ask if there are problems/issues
- Meetings (Bi-weekly, Monthly)
- Keep Roll
- Find Replacement / Substitute
- Follow personally
- Weekly Reminder

5- Are you following the volunteer guidelines and safe environment practices?

- Protecting Gods Children
- Safe environment (food, children, kitchen)

Findings:

Angela: Some participants were clueless about guidelines for volunteer and safe environment practices. They seem to be confused and they expressed that guidelines need to be communicated better to all volunteers. Some of them didn't know that Saint Luke has guideline for volunteers. Some of them asked if all volunteers needed to take Protecting Gods Children training even if they did not work directly with children?

Gary: I thought most understood that if we deal with children, we need to take the child safety courses. I also believe that most agree that all volunteers need to take the course. I agree that some wanted good guidelines and I believe our handout (thanks to whoever put this together!), is what they need.

Mission for your Ministry & Working together with other Ministries Led by Pamela Weghorst and Kate Chapman

Parishioners might be inspired by seeing how many are involved and want to be part of it, and may realize someone familiar might be able to tell them more about a ministry
 Calendar: Not mobile-device friendly Reservations that include multiple rooms only show one room unless you clickso people think they have checked the calendar, but don't see extent of reservation Information on events too vague 	 Look for ways to make calendar easier to access on mobile devices. Include more detailed information for each event, including: Set-up time Event time Clean-up time Schedule "anchor events" for the entire year at a collaboration that includes relevant staff and ministry leads from both Englishand Spanish-speaking communities
Overlapping/conflicting communications protocols	 More standardization throughout parish Planning Center for scheduling volunteers Quarterly email or newsletter that goes to all staff, ministry leads, etc. Could highlight major events coming up on the calendar (Save the Date), ministry updates, policy updates, a place to send out feelers for collaboration SLT working more visibly with ministries/commissions—perhaps post liaison list with pictures on website Ministries should be more consistent about sharing information with their staff liaisons
Encourage more parishioner involvement	 Easily identifiable ministry nametags for everyone to wear Have a day where everyone that represents a ministry, wear a colored t-shirt to represent their ministry

BREAKOUT: COMMUNICATION Led by Celinda Erickson, Mary O'Connor and Jill Reed

- Resource Guide Suggestions:
 - Create headings in the Table of Contents (Draft Resource Guide) for better organization of topics
 - o Make the booklet Mobile Friendly
 - Include ADA information
 - Include emergency phone numbers
 - Add link to ministries online
 - Include a facilities map
 - Add location of resources (ex: where are various supplies/equipment)
- Ministries how can they help to "evangelize"/ inspire people to attend Mass
- Look for ways to coordinate events between the ministries
- Suggestion for new ministry members to talk after Mass on Stewardship Sundays
- Creation of multiple avenues for communication of events
- "Like" and "Share" your events through social media
- Create directory of all ministry leads
- Go to St Luke website and check/update your ministry email address
- On social media, feature individuals from different ministries
- Creation of weekly ministry feature/highlight across all mediums of social media/weekly newsletter

Vision Planning for 2019 Led by Brian Cohanski

Goals – Getting all ministries to work together, focus on main initiatives for the church and prioritize resources. In addition, continue to ensure your ministry has the church mission and the pastoral plan in the forefront of everyone's mind when planning meetings, events, and anything related to the work of your ministry.

Though our time was short, we appreciate everyone's engagement, energy, and commitment to serve with a heart like Jesus. In order to foster collaboration and get everyone involved, we used large buckets of priorities to help with cross collaboration. One large bucket not discussed was Outreach. This was not intentional, and we apologize for the oversight. One goal of the session was how to maximize and understand calendar and physical resources within the church to center our priorities around the Church's mission. With exceptions, of course, Outreach is typically focused on areas outside the church. Again, our apologies for the oversight

- Mass
- Sacraments
- Education
- Retreats
- Fall Festival

We understand these were just examples and starting points. Everyone's ministry and work is equally important. We simply used these buckets to group people together to high level conversations and to help prioritize the resources available to help us focus on being a Christ Centered Church.

Though we didn't have time to debrief and recap the work and discussions in great detail, here are some examples, based on our conversations and notes on the charts on ways we can collaborate and help each other:

- Mass:
 - Need: Mass Coordinators
- Sacraments:
 - Confirmation: Needs: Small group leaders & food help (classes and retreats)
- Retreats
 - Needs: Participants (Encourage ministries to attend as groups)
 - Space
- Fall Festival:
 - Needs: Committee Leads
 - o Teams to set up prior to the event and teams to break down, after the event
 - Ministry donations: Baskets, Action Items, etc.
 - Church and outdoor space for set-up, festival and clean-up

There were other examples, but this is a start of how we can work together in a cross functional manner to help one another while also focusing on being a Christ Centered church responsive to the needs of all; preserving, spreading and celebrating the teachings of Jesus; and offering hope, comfort and peace.

We courage you, as leaders of ministries, to reach out directly to other ministry leaders to plan events together and to feel empowered to ask one another for help. We hope that the retreat helped raise awareness of ministries' needs and resources.
