O my God, I am heartily sorry for having offended Thee, and I detest all my sins because of thy just punishments, but most of all because they offend Thee, my God, who are all good and deserving of all my love. I firmly resolve with the help of Thy grace to sin no more and to avoid the near occasion of sin. Amen.

The Ten Commandments

- 1. I, the Lord, am your God. You shall not have other gods besides me.
- 2. You shall not take the name of the Lord, your God, in vain.
- 3. Remember to keep holy the Lord's day.
- 4. Honor your father and your mother.
- 5. You shall not kill.
- 6. You shall not commit adultery.
- 7. You shall not steal.
- 8. You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor.
- 9. You shall not covet your neighbor's wife.
- 10. You shall not covet your neighbor's goods.

The Beatitudes

The Beatitudes are the teachings of Jesus in the Sermon on the Mount (Matthew 5:1-10). Jesus teaches us that if we live according to the Beatitudes, we will live a happy Christian life. The Beatitudes fulfill God's promises made to Abraham and his descendants and describe the rewards that will be ours as loyal followers of Christ.

- 1. Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.
- 2. Blessed are they who mourn, for they will be comforted.
- 3. Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the land.
- 4. Blessed are they who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be satisfied.
- 5. Blessed are the merciful, for they will be shown mercy.
- 6. Blessed are the clean in heart, for they will see God.
- 7. Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God.
- 8. Blessed are they who are persecuted for the sake of righteousness, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

Precepts of the Church

The Precepts of the Church describe the minimum effort we must make in prayer and in living a moral life. All Catholics are called to move beyond the minimum by growing in love of God and love of neighbor.

- 1. Attendance at Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation
- 2. Confession of serious sin at least once a year
- 3. Reception of Holy Communion at least once a year during the Easter season
- 4. Observance of the days of fast and abstinence
- 5. Providing for the needs of the Church

Seven Sacraments: Baptism, Reconciliation, Eucharist, Confirmation, Matrimony, Holy Orders, and Anointing of the Sick

Theological Virtues: Faith, Hope, Love

Cardinal Virtues: Prudence (good discernment), Justice, Fortitude (courage), Temperance (moderation)

Gifts of the Holy Spirit: Wisdom, Understanding, Knowledge, Counsel, Fortitude (courage), Piety (reverence), Fear of the Lord (wonder and awe)

Fruits of the Holy Spirit: Charity (love), Joy, Peace, Patience, Kindness, Goodness, Generosity, Gentleness, Faithfulness, Modesty, Self-Control, Chastity

Corporal Works of Mercy:

- 1. Feed the hungry.
- 2. Give drink to the thirsty.
- 3. Clothe the naked.
- 4. Visit the imprisoned.
- 5. Shelter the homeless.
- 6. Visit the sick.
- 7. Bury the dead.

Spiritual Works of Mercy:

- 1. Admonish the sinner. (Give correction to those who need it.)
- 2, Instruct the ignorant. (Share our knowledge with others.)
- 3, Counsel the doubtful. (Give advice to those who need it.)
- 4, Comfort the sorrowful. (Comfort those who suffer.)
- 5. Bear wrongs patiently. (Be patient with others.)
- 6. Forgive all injuries. (Forgive those who hurt us.)
- 7. Pray for the living and the dead.

The Bible

Gospels: Matthew, Mark, Luke, John

Pentateuch (first 5 books): Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers, Deuteronomy

Covenants:

Edenic—One holy couple: Adam and Eve (Gen 1-3)

Noahic—One holy family: Noah and his family (Gen 9)

Abrahamic—One holy tribe: Abraham (Gen 15, 17, 22)

Mosaic—One holy nation: Moses (Ex 24, Deut 29)

Davidic—One holy kingdom: David (2 Sam 7:11-15)

Prophetic—One holy people: the prophets (Jer 31, Heb 8:8)

Eucharistic—One holy Church: Jesus Christ (Matt 16:18, Luke 22:1-23)

Kerygma (The Proclamation of the Good News)

The basic message of the Kerygma can be broken down into these 7 parts:

- 1. God loves you and has plan for your life.
- 2. Sin will destroy you.
- 3. Christ Jesus died to save you.
- 4. Repent and believe the Gospel.
- 5. Be Baptized and receive the Holy Spirit.
- 6. Abide in Christ and his body the Church.
- 7. Go make disciples.
