All Souls Day

All Souls Day is on Sunday, November 2. During November, we remember and pray for all souls in purgatory. It is actually the third day of a triduum called *Allhallowtide*. Allhallowtide encompasses All Hallows' Eve on October 31 (Halloween), All Saints Day on November 1, and All Souls Day on November 2.

Catholics believe that when a baptized person dies, they go to purgatory for the purification of their venial sins. We know the living on earth can assist the purification process through prayer. The Catechism of the Catholic Church says, "All who die in God's grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified, are indeed assured of their eternal salvation; but after death they undergo purification so as to attain the holiness necessary to enter the joy of Heaven. The Church gives the name 'Purgatory' to this final purification...which is entirely different from the punishment of the damned."

Before we enter Heaven, Jesus said that we must "be perfect as the heavenly Father is perfect." (Matthew 5:48; Revelation 3:2) So, continue to pray for your departed loved ones so that they may obtain perfection and ultimately go to Heaven.

At the entrances to the church, you will find envelopes for All Souls Day, where you can write the names of your deceased, and they will be placed on the altar during the month of November.
